Student Artists Draw Applause at Nolde Forest Art Contest Awards

Berks County, PA A crowd of 80+ people was on hand Saturday to give a hand to the participants in the third annual "Nature of Nolde Forest" Student Art Contest.

The contest, which was launched in early September, was open to all Berks County schools, grades 1 through 12. It was supported by The Friends of Nolde Forest and coordinated by Art Plus Gallery, a non-profit artist cooperative in West Reading.

The artwork of 53 finalists was selected for the exhibit at Nolde Mansion, which also houses the administrative offices for Nolde Forest Environmental Education Center, Cumru Township. Most of the finalists were chosen by the 21 schools that registered for the event. Students were also allowed to enter the contest independently, and Art Plus Gallery selected several additional finalists from this group.

The show, which was open to the public for the first two weeks of December, culminated in Saturday's awards presentation at Nolde's McConnell Hall environmental education center.

The artwork was judged by members of Art Plus Gallery, and cash awards presented to the winners. The prizes were funded primarily by The Friends of Nolde Forest.
