# Near Carlisle, PA

- Boyd Big Tree Preserve Hiking through a beech grove and large field, view many butterflies and birds.
- Joseph E. Ibberson Conservation Area- 350 acre-tract of land is excellent for hiking and wild-life watching.
- Buchanan's Birthplace State Park Learn about the 15th president of the United States and the only one from Pennsylvania!
- Caledonia State Park Great for the history buff! This park served as a field hospital during the Battle of Gettysburg.
- Mont Alto State Park In spring and summer, cast your line for trout in the West Branch of Antietam Creek; in winter, enjoy access to the public snowmobiling trails at Michaux State Forest.
- Michaux State Forest Hiking, history, scenic vistas, mountain biking. Need I say more?
- Pine Grove Furnace State Park Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it is home to the old Pine Grove Iron Works, which dates back to 1764. Visit the Appalachian Trail Museum or the restored mansion.
- Buchanan State Forest Explore rugged Martin Hill, hike the Mid-State Trail or visit the Sweet Root Natural Area.
- **Kings Gap State Park** Provides a beautiful panoramic view of the Cumberland valley from the patio of a 38-room stone mansion. 18 miles of hiking trails weave through the park.
- Tuscarora State Forest Visit the Hemlock Natural Area, Box Huckleberry Natural Area (where the plant is over 1300 years old!), and the Masland Natural Area.
- **Big Spring State Forest Picnic Area** Pack a lunch to enjoy at this quaint picnic and hiking area. Check out the partially completed railroad tunnel, or connect with the Iron Horse Trail for day and overnight hiking.
- Fowlers Hollow State Park Great trails for snowmobilers, equestrians, and hikers with its expansive trail system.
- Colonel Denning State Park Families enjoy the lake and beach. Flat Rock hike is both exhilarating and beautiful.
- Gifford Pinchot State Park The large lake is great for sail boating, kayaking, and fishing. Disc golf also available here.
- Little Buffalo State Park Shoaff's Grist Mill located within the park is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. A large swimming area provides fun for the kids.
- Codorus State Park The 1,275-acre Lake Marburg is popular for sailboats and motorboats. Anglers love the lake and can also fish Codorus Creek for trout. Picnicking, swimming in the pool and camping are popular activities.
