Near Wellsboro

- Mt. Pisgah State Park Pack a picnic lunch, visit the nature center or take a dip in the pool.
- Ricketts Glen State Park Hike the Falls Trails and explore the Glens, which boasts a series of free-flowing waterfalls, in one of the most scenic areas in Pennsylvania.
- Loyalsock State Forest- Miles of well-maintained roads open the forest to horseback riding, hiking and fishing.
- Worlds End State Park Enjoy spectacular scenery and vistas while camping, hiking or cross country skiing.
- Susquehanna State Park This park is the launching site for the riverboat Hiawatha, offering river excursions.
- Ravensburg State Park Especially beautiful in June and October, this park offers picnicking, camping and fishing.
- Little Pine State Park Little Pine Lake, hiking trails, camping, and nesting bald eagles are prime attractions.
- **Upper Pine Bottom State Park** Visitors often use the parking area of this small roadside picnic site for access to hiking, cross-country skiing, snowmobiling and hunting in the surrounding Tiadaghton State Forest.
- Ole Bull State Park A premier trout fishing spot, swimming, hiking, biking, and camping along the Kettle Creek.
- Tiadaghton State Forest -Wildlife watching and scenic drives, especially during the fall, are popular activities.
- Cherry Springs State Park Bring a telescope for an evening of unparalleled views of the night sky.
- Hills Creek State Park -Camping, cabins, swimming, boating, and hiking make this an ideal spot for family vacations.
- **Tioga State Forest** The forest is home to the Pine Creek Gorge, also known as the "Grand Canyon of Pennsylvania." Great spots for picnicking, hiking and biking.
- Leonard Harrison State Park Enjoy great bicycling on the 62 mile Pine Creek Rail Trail, offering fabulous views.
- Susquehannock State Forest- Sixteen vistas provide magnificent views of the forest for hikers to enjoy.
- Colton Point State Park Rugged overlooks offer great views of the Grand Canyon of PA.
- Patterson State Park-A 15 mile mountain bike path connecting Denton Hill and Cherry Springs state parks passes through this remotely located park. Visitors enjoy the two rustic picnic pavilions.
- Denton Hill State Park -In winter there is great downhill skiing. Summers bring a variety of outdoor events.
- Lyman Run State Park Offering water recreation, picnicking and hiking.
- **Hyner Run State Park** —named for the trout stream that flows through the park. Great wildlife viewing and hiking trails.
- Hyner View State Park features a scenic vista overlooking the Susquehanna River. Hang gliding is popular.
