Why is storytelling on social media so important?



Storytelling on social media can:

- Help foster a sense of community and appreciation for the state park or forest
- Educate on the park, history, biodiversity, how to's, processes, etiquette of using the park/forest, resources, etc
- Encourage others to explore
- Preserve memories
- Inspire others to share their stories



What are some ways to generate ideas for social media posts?



- What has never been told or shared?
- What's neat about your park/forest you see often you don't think about it but maybe other's don't know its story?
- Appeal to diverse interests
 - less popular activities
 - unexpected outdoor recreation
- Talk to the person you see regularly and ask them to take a photo/video and why they visit
- Take photos of what's going on, even if it seems uneventful
- Talk about your accomplishments
- Make someone/thing feel special or highlight them/it
- Take a photo in the same spot for different seasons or occasions
- Tell the story of the trail, the lake, a day in the life of the park manager or volunteer or regular visitor
