Appalachian National Scenic Trail

While the Appalachian Trail is rich in gorgeous scenery, Hawk Rock in Perry County, PA offers a relatively accessible overlook of the Susquehanna River. From the gravel parking lot off of Watershed Drive, the trail follows white rectangular blazes for about 2 miles, at which point the effort is rewarded

with the view from Hawk Rock.

Ohiopyle State Park

The Baughman Trail actually begins at the Baughman Overlook just a short walk from the parking lot. From here, the view of the Youghiogheny River Gorge is breathtaking. The strenuous trail

continues in a 4.8 mile loop marked with red blazes, but for an easier hike, look no further than the Fern

Cliff Trail. This shorter 1.8 mile loop is relatively flat, and provides multiple overlooks of the Youghiogheny River. So long as hikers follow the black blazes, they should have a great time!

Colonel Dennings State Park

Next to the Environmental Classroom Amphitheater

in Colonel Denning
State Park is a
footbridge that also
serves as the
trailhead for the Flat
Rock Trail.
Following the trail,
the red blazes that
mark the way turn
blue as hikers leave
the state park and
enter Tuscarora
State Forest. After
hiking 2.5 miles, the
trail ends up at the

top of Blue Mountain at the titular overlook, an immense outcrop of natural rock.
